

Maths

In Maths we will be looking at place value for numbers up to ten million. We will be ordering and writing larger numbers. The children will learn to round numbers to the nearest ten, hundred and thousand for any number up to million. We will learn how to multiply and divide numbers by two digits using a written method.

English

In English, we will initially study 'Krinklekrax' as a text, before moving on to link work with our history topic. We will look at writing different genres and text types. Including a story involving a range of settings, newspaper reports, biographies and chronological reports.

Science

In Science, we will be studying the properties of materials. This will include looking at reversible and irreversible changes.

We will look at online safety and personal information. Then we will study coding using variables.

Maths

2. Measure objects in your house. Then round all the measurements to the nearest ten cm.
3. Use a hundred square (supplied) to mark ticks on all the different timetables (in different colours). So, for example, a green tick in each number in the 3 times table, a blue tick in each number in the four times table). Which numbers have the most ticks? Which have the least?
