## English

We will be using the book 'Stone Age Boy' by Satoshi Kitamura as inspiration for our writing this half term.

We will also look at writing fact files linked to our topic on rocks.

## History

## Science

## English

3. If you could give something from 2024 to the Stone Age people to improve their life, what would you give them? Draw a picture of three items and explain why you have chosen them.

## Topic

1. Use natural materials to create a picture of the Stone Age. You could create types of paint by crushing berries, grass and leaves and other natural materials.
2. Make your own quiz of facts about the Stone Age. Make sure you include your answers.
3. How did people first settle during the Stone Age? How did they travel and where did they come from? Present your information however you wish.
4. Conduct some research into Stone Age houses. Create your own 3D model using natural materials.
